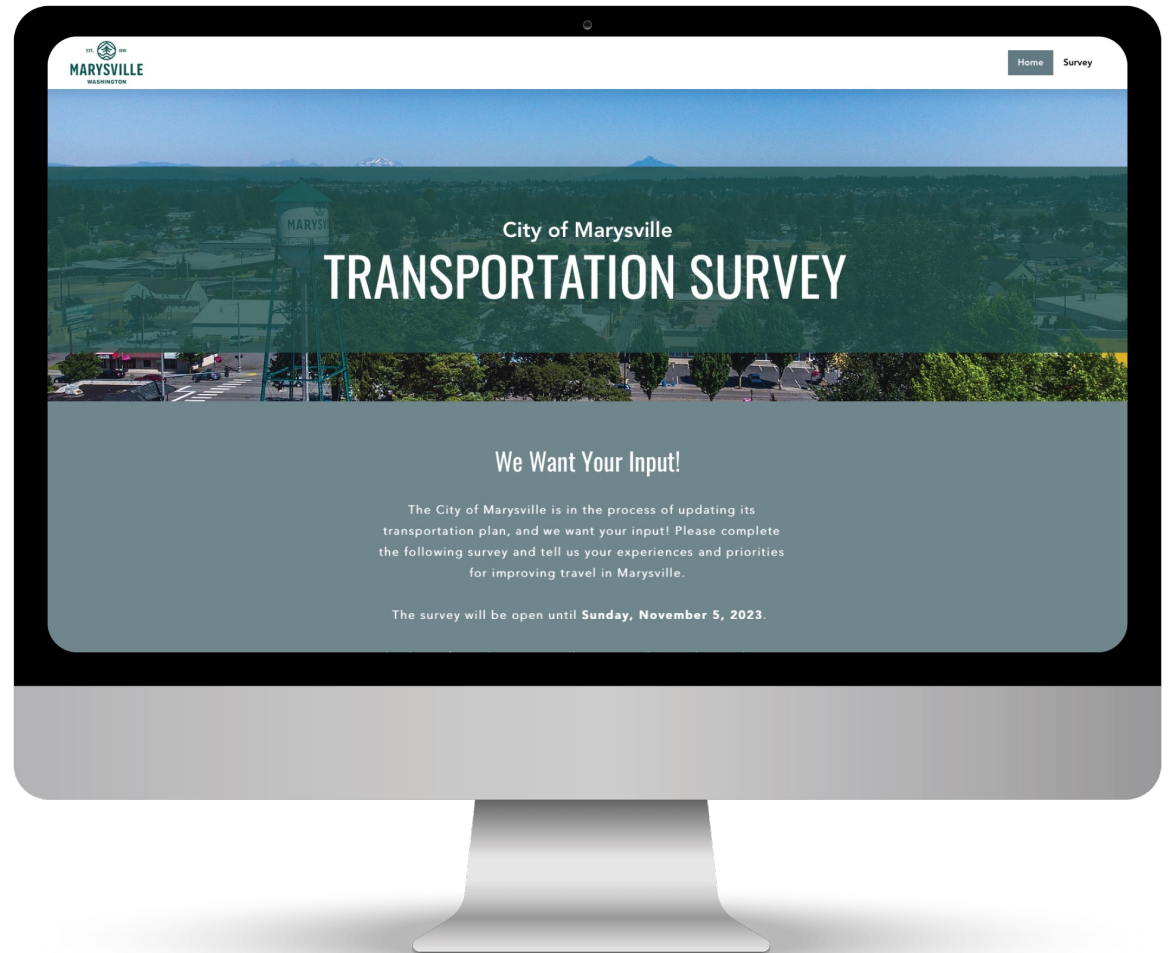

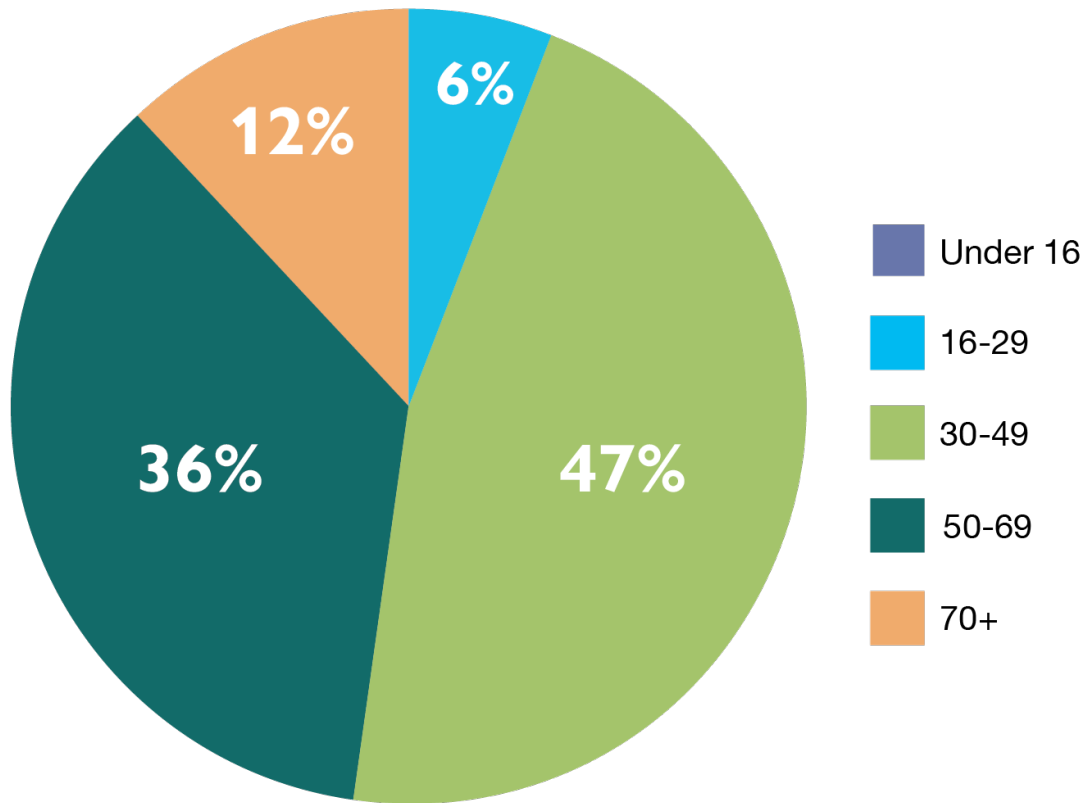

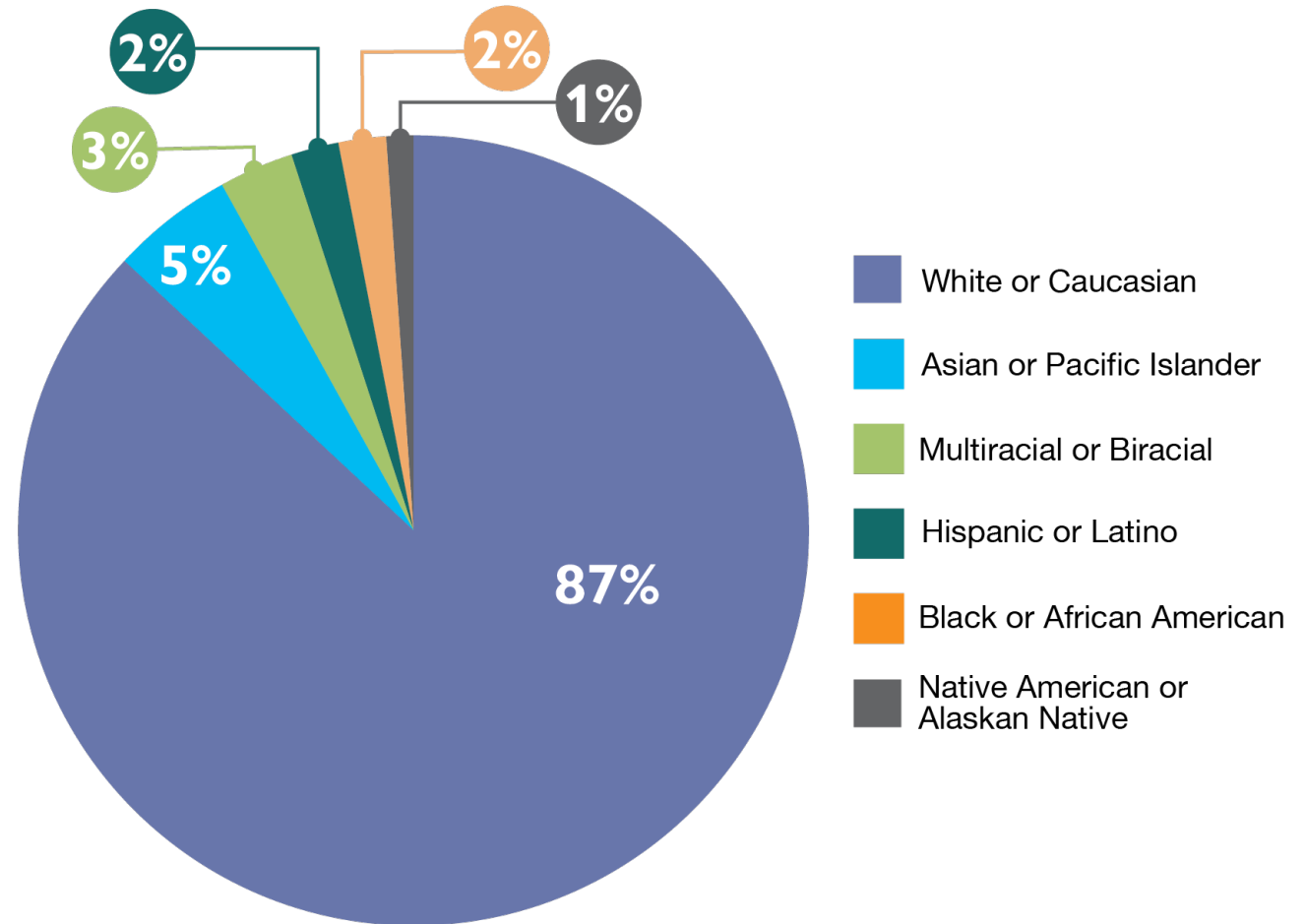

Age

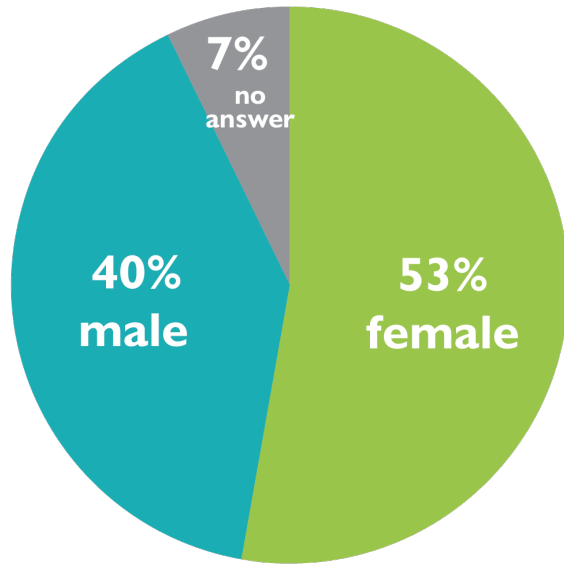


Race/Ethnicity

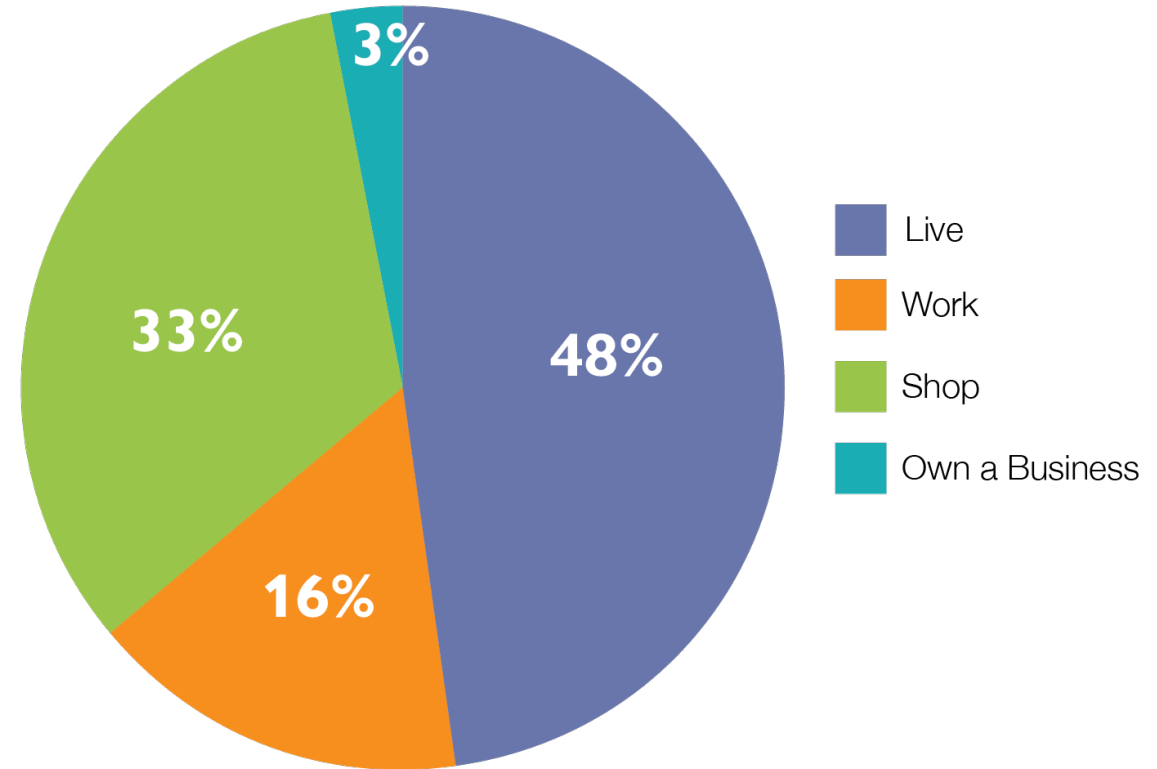

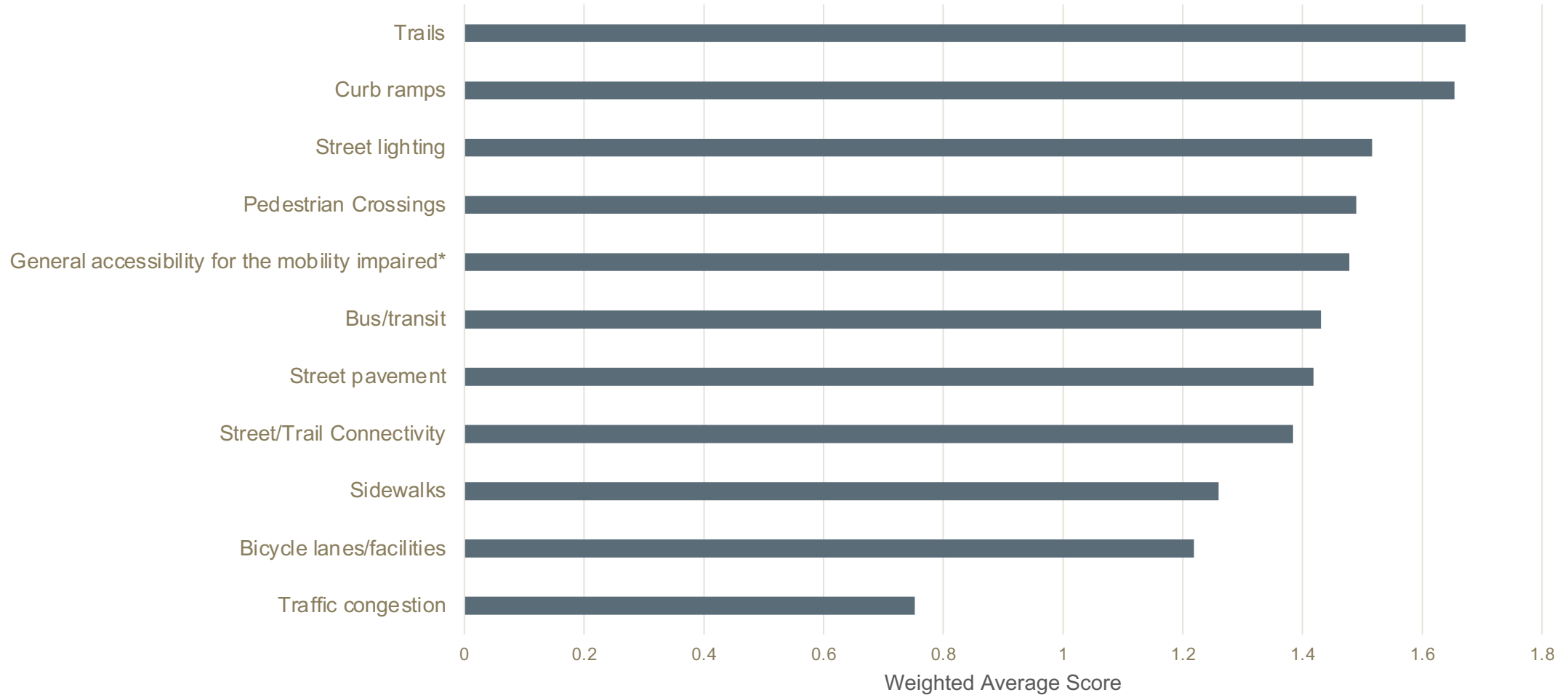

Q2: EXISTING SYSTEM RATING

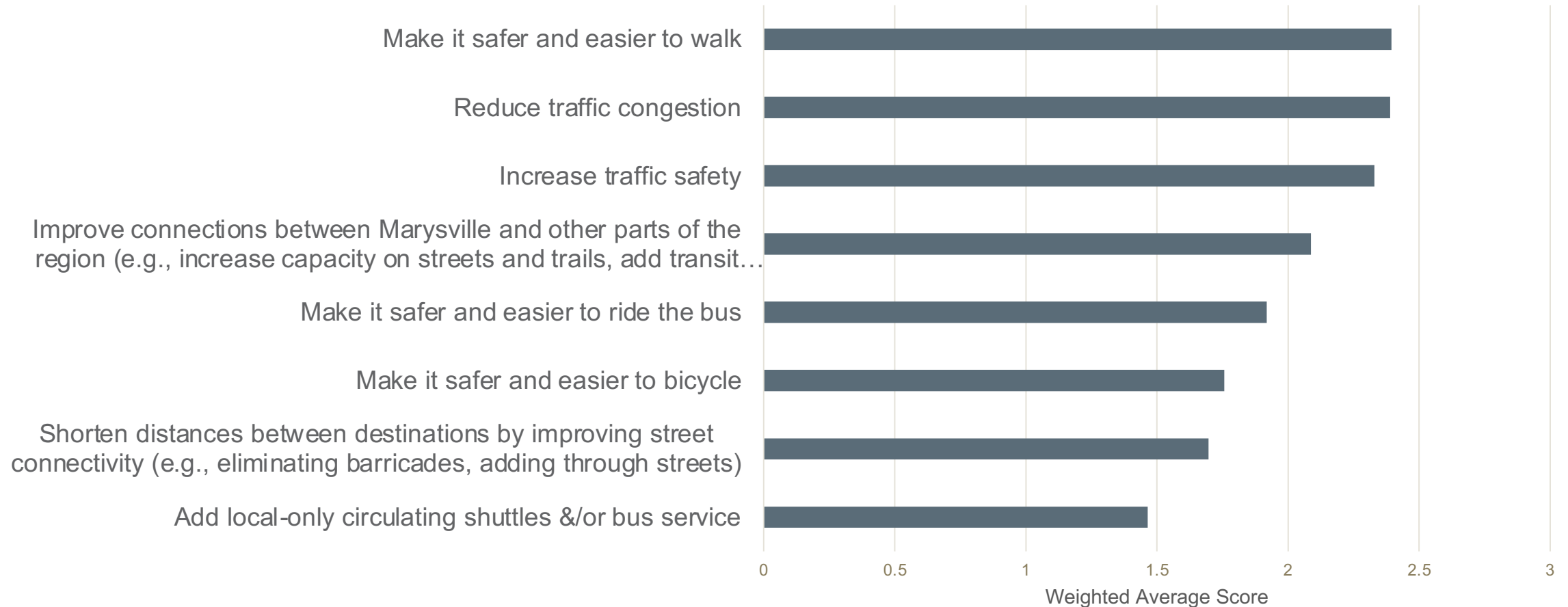
2. Overall, how would you rate the existing transportation systems in the City?

Q3: GOAL PRIORITIES

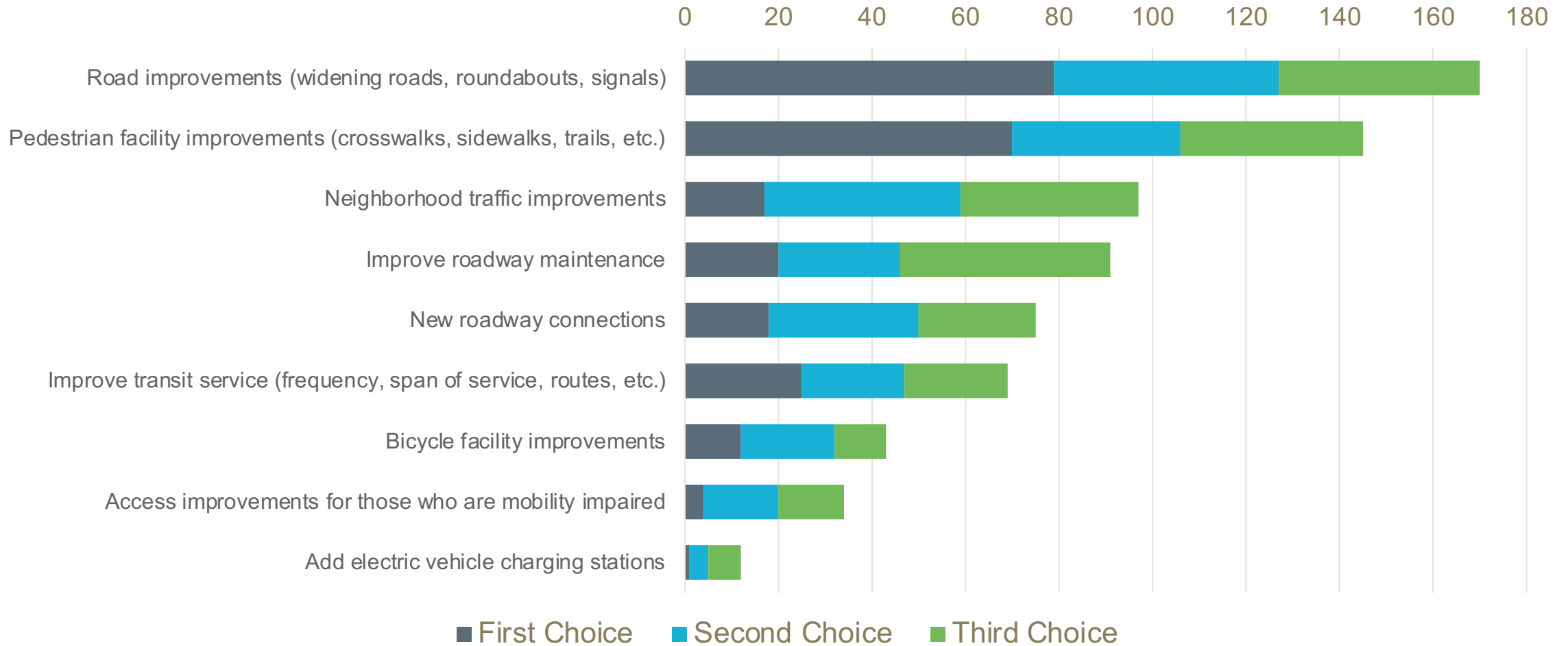
3. As the City updates its long-term Transportation Plan, how important do you think it is to achieve each of the following goals?

(Weighted average score based on: 3 = essential, 2 = very, 1 = somewhat, and 0 = not)



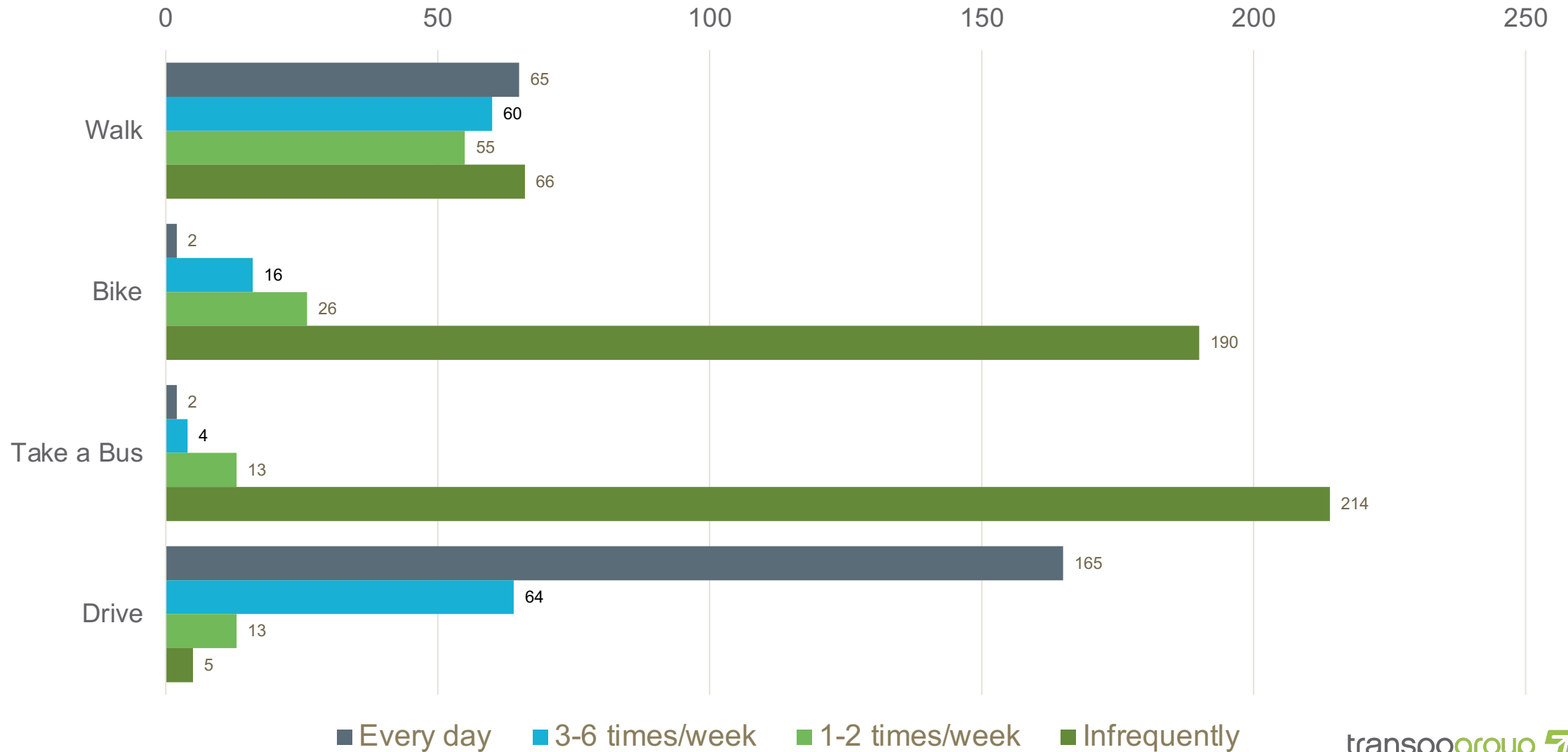

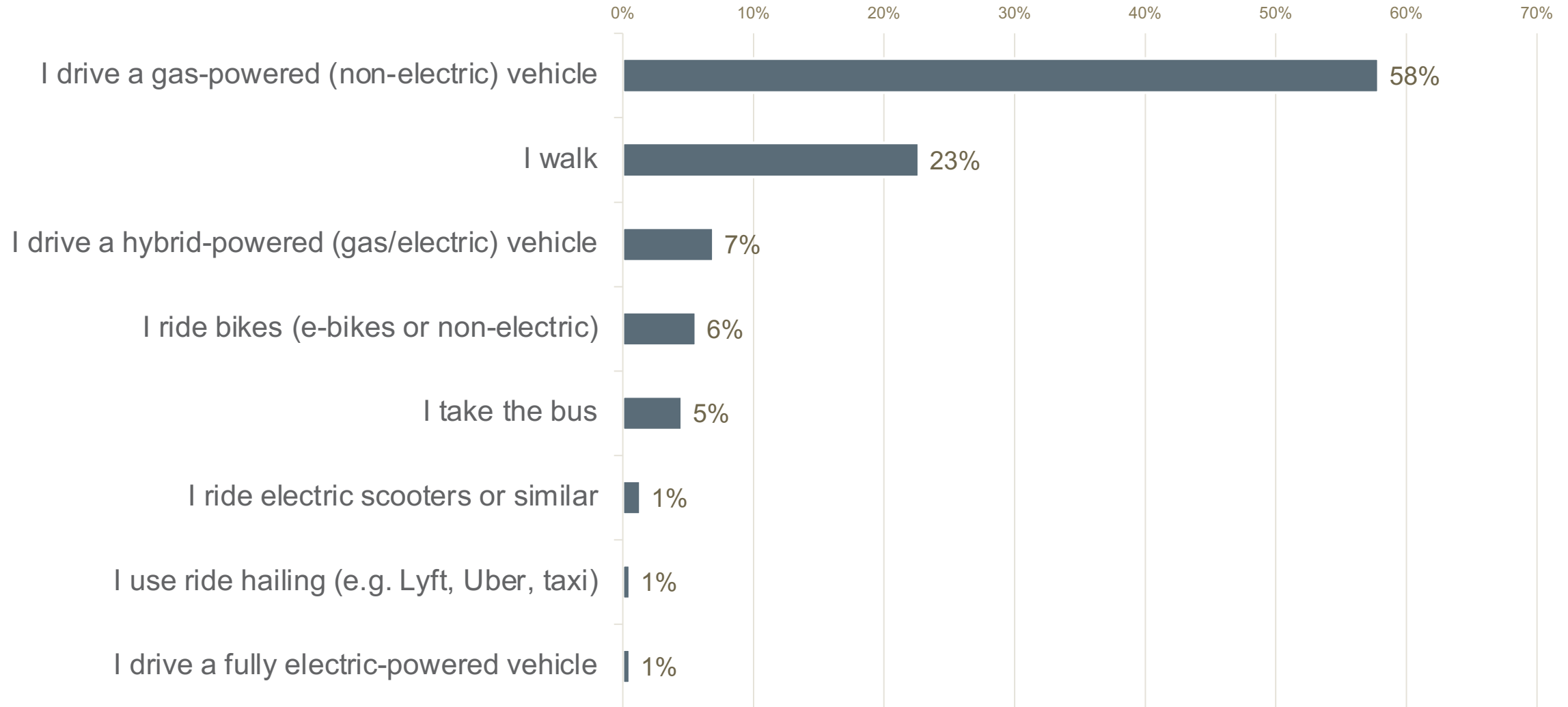

5. How often do you walk, bike, bus, or drive to various locations throughout the City?



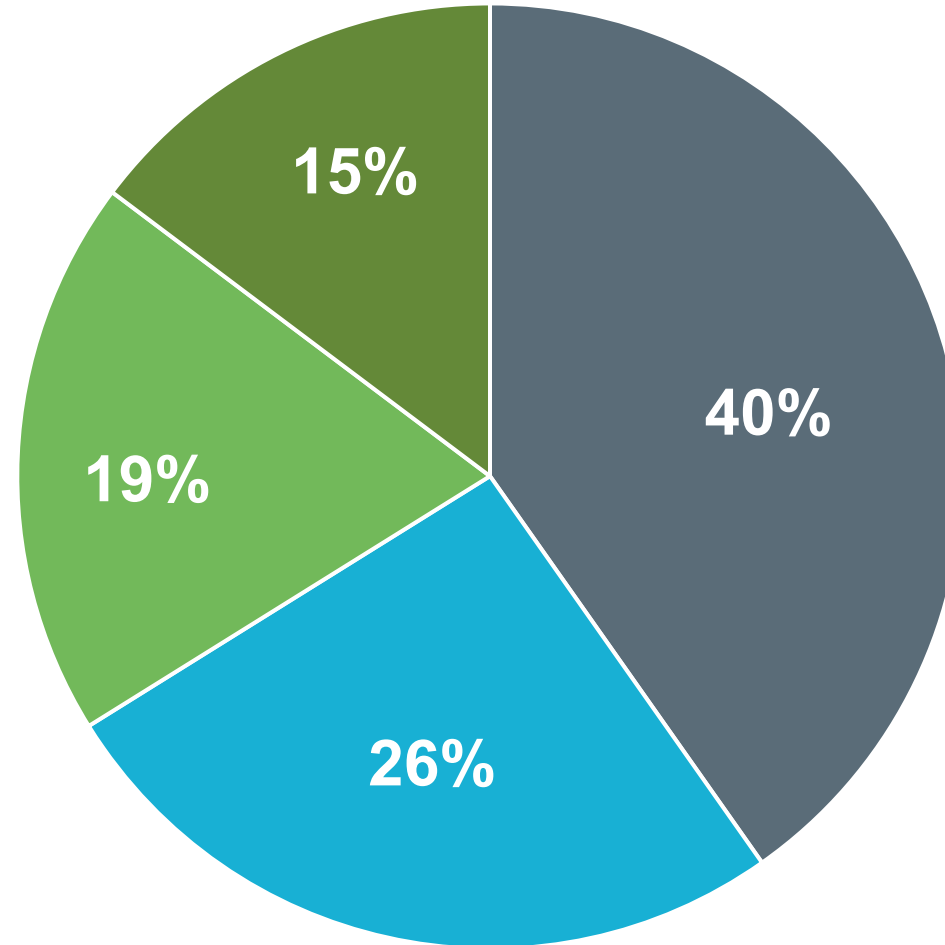

Q7: AVERAGE TRIP DISTANCE

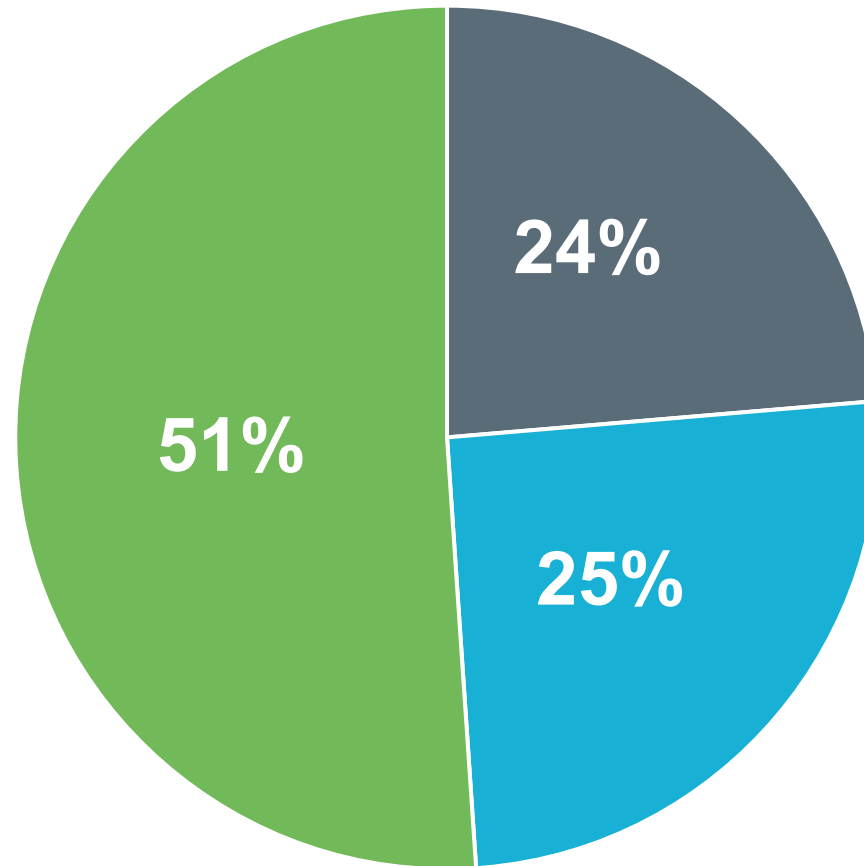
7. How many miles do you travel on an average day? (%)

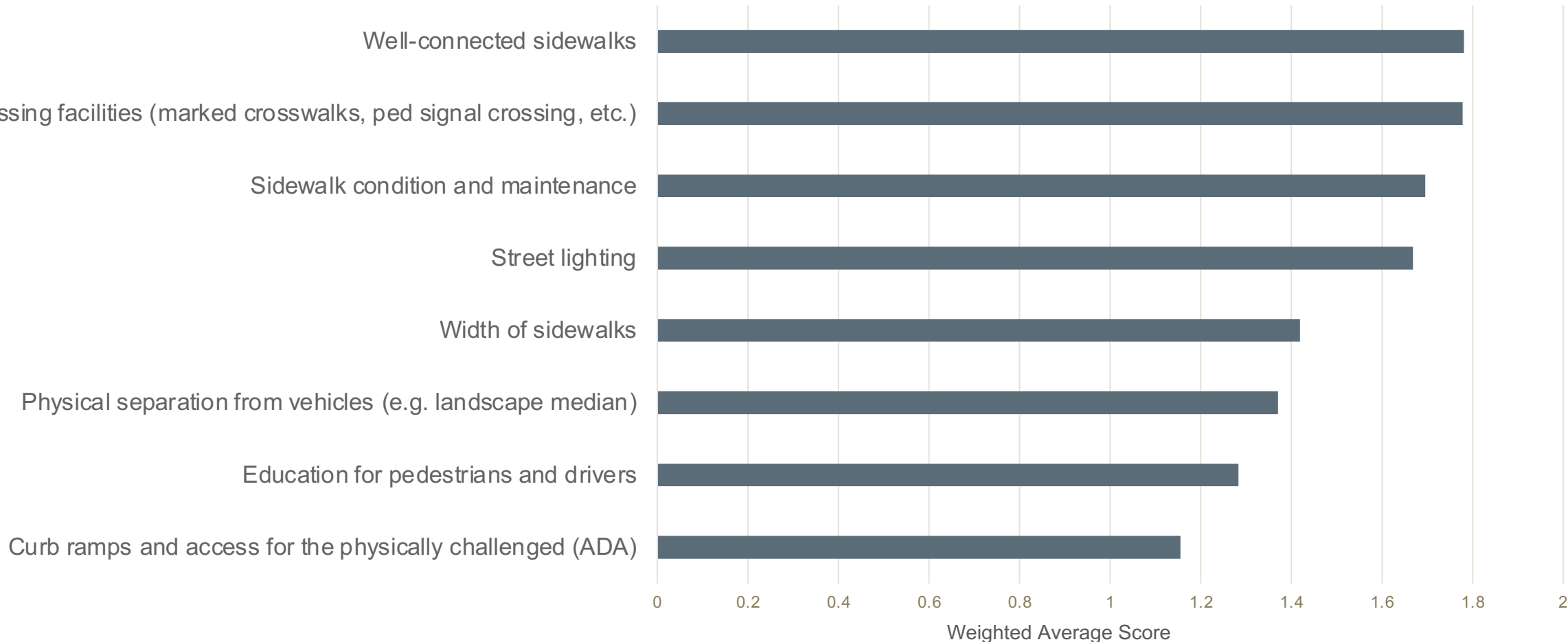
8. If you are employed, what is your regular work schedule? (%)

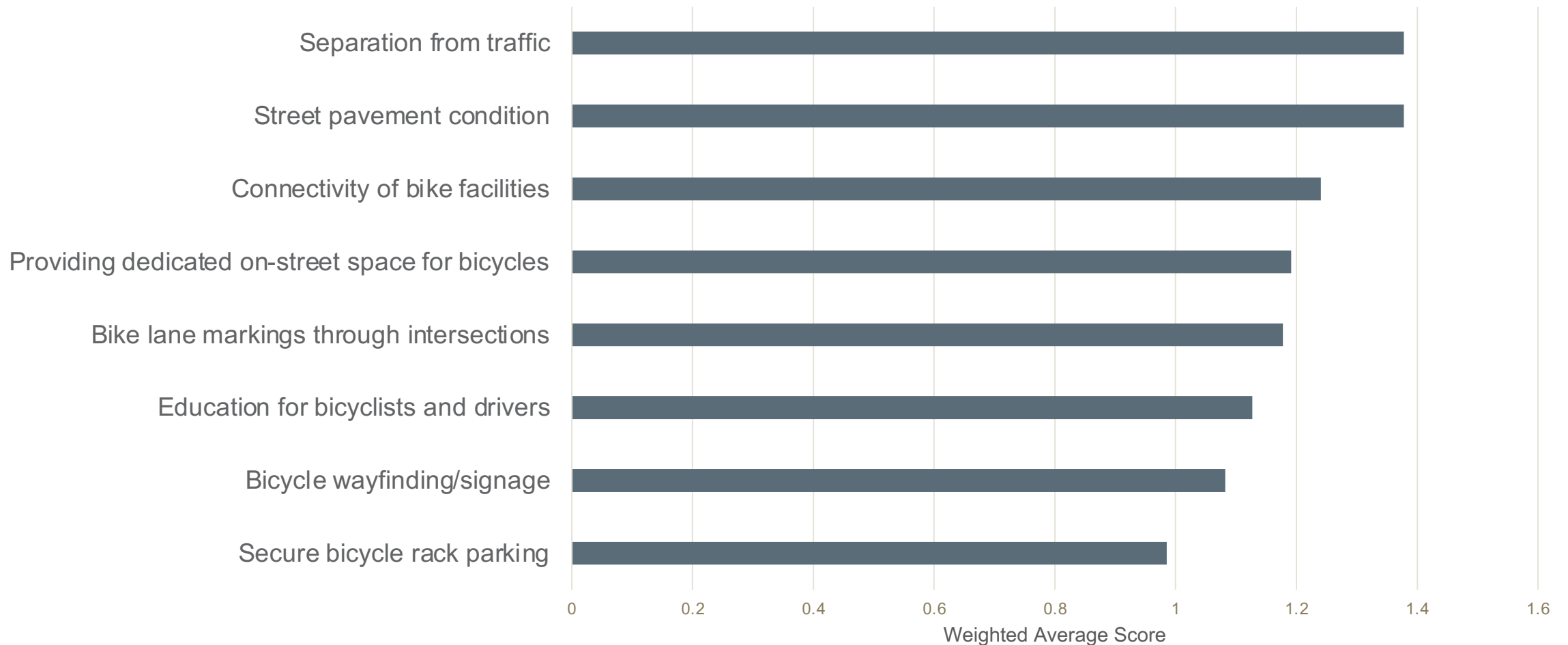

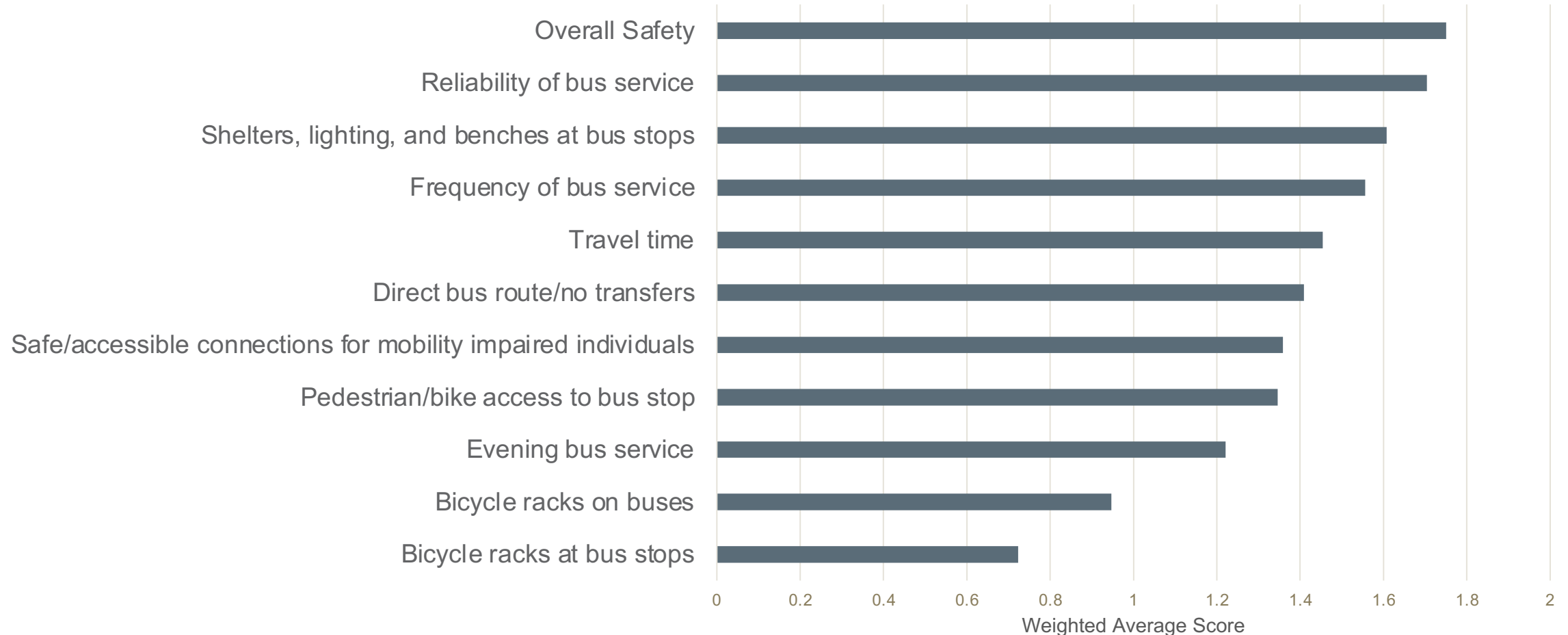
Q10: BIKE PRIORITIES

(Weighted average score based on: 2 = very, 1 = somewhat, and 0 = not)



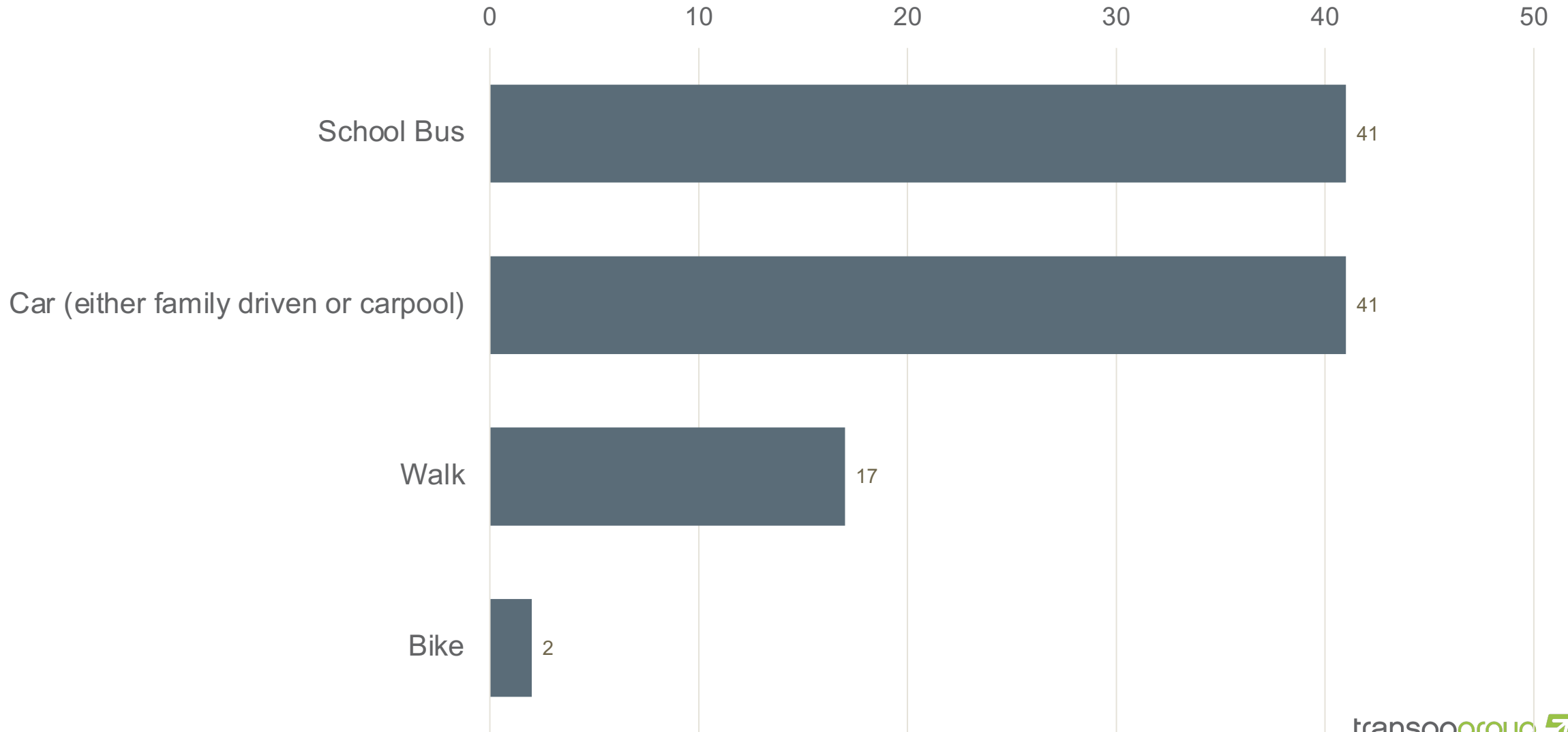

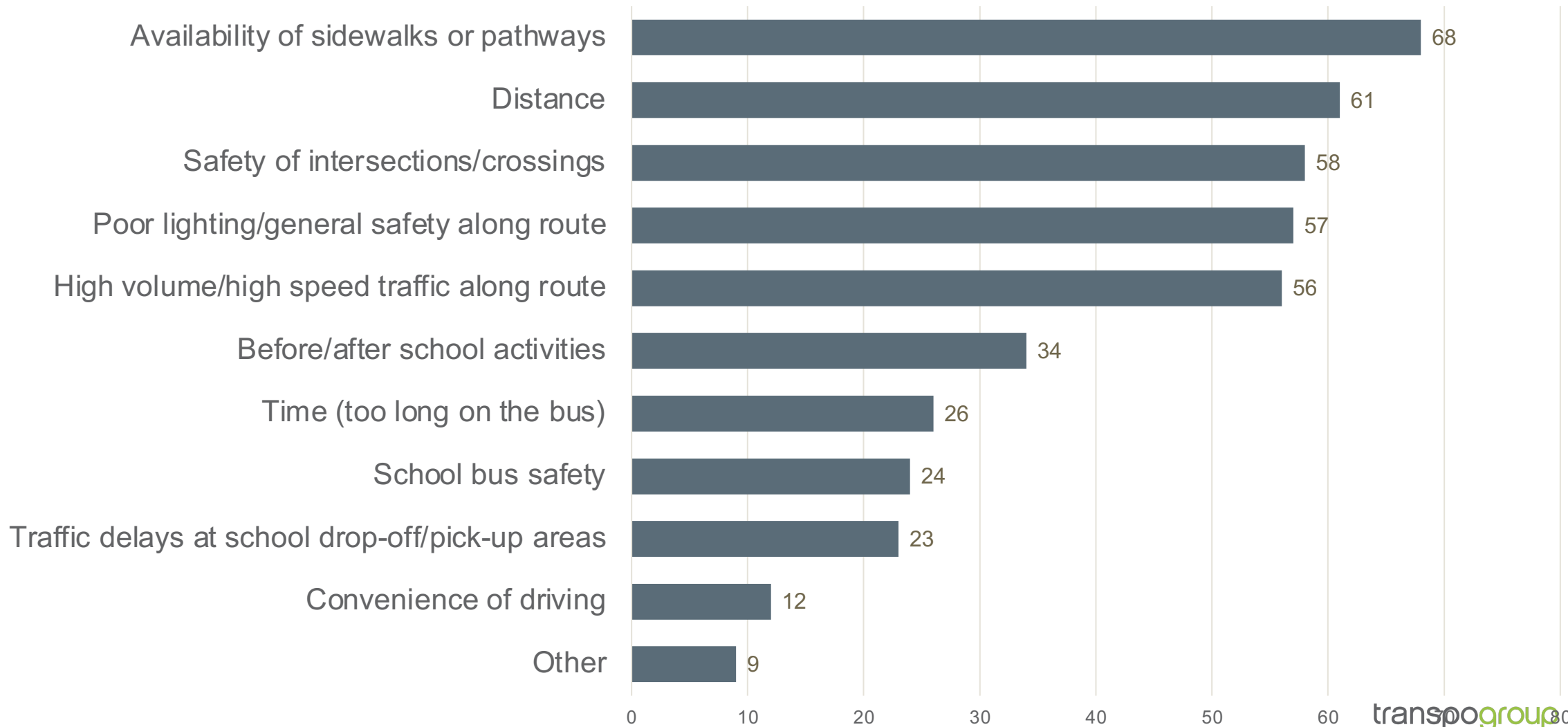

12. On most days, how does your school-age child get to/from school?



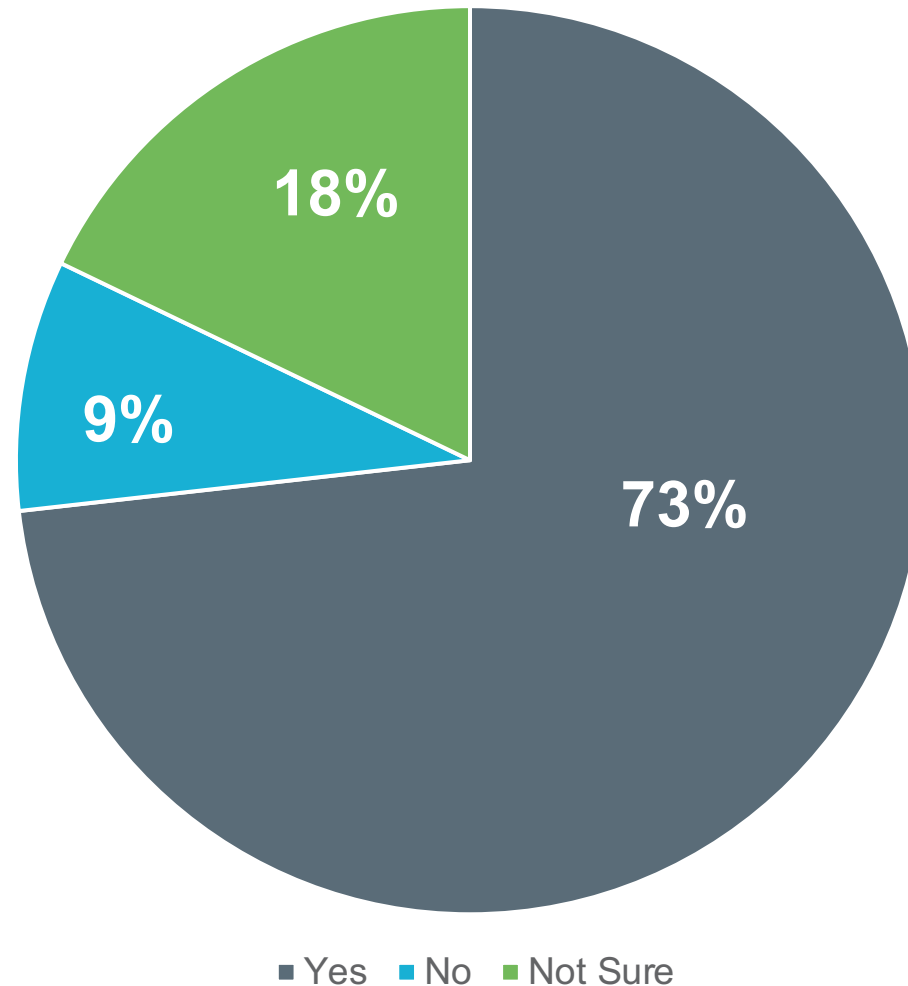
Q13: FACTORS ON SCHOOL MODE CHOICE

13. Which of the following issues might affect your decision to allow or not allow your child to walk/bike or take the district-provided school bus?



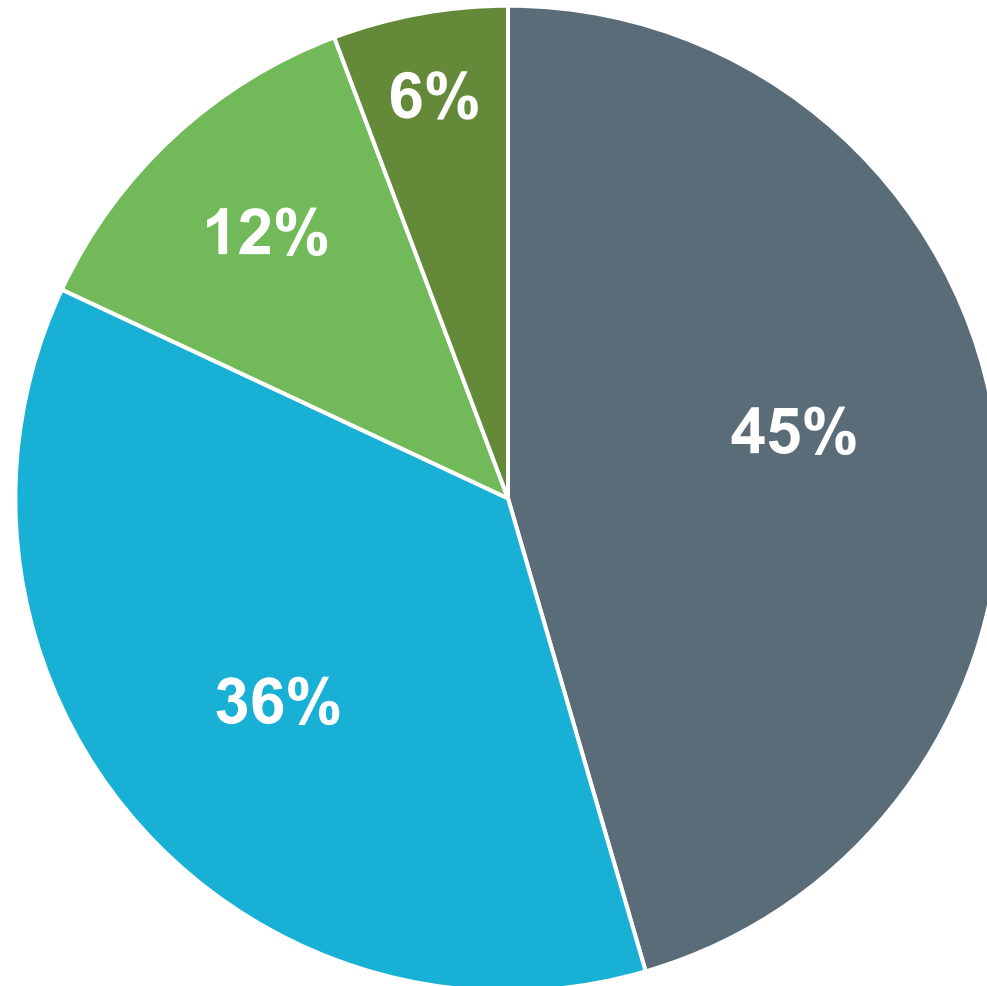
Q14: POTENTIAL FOR SHIFTS IN SCHOOL MODES

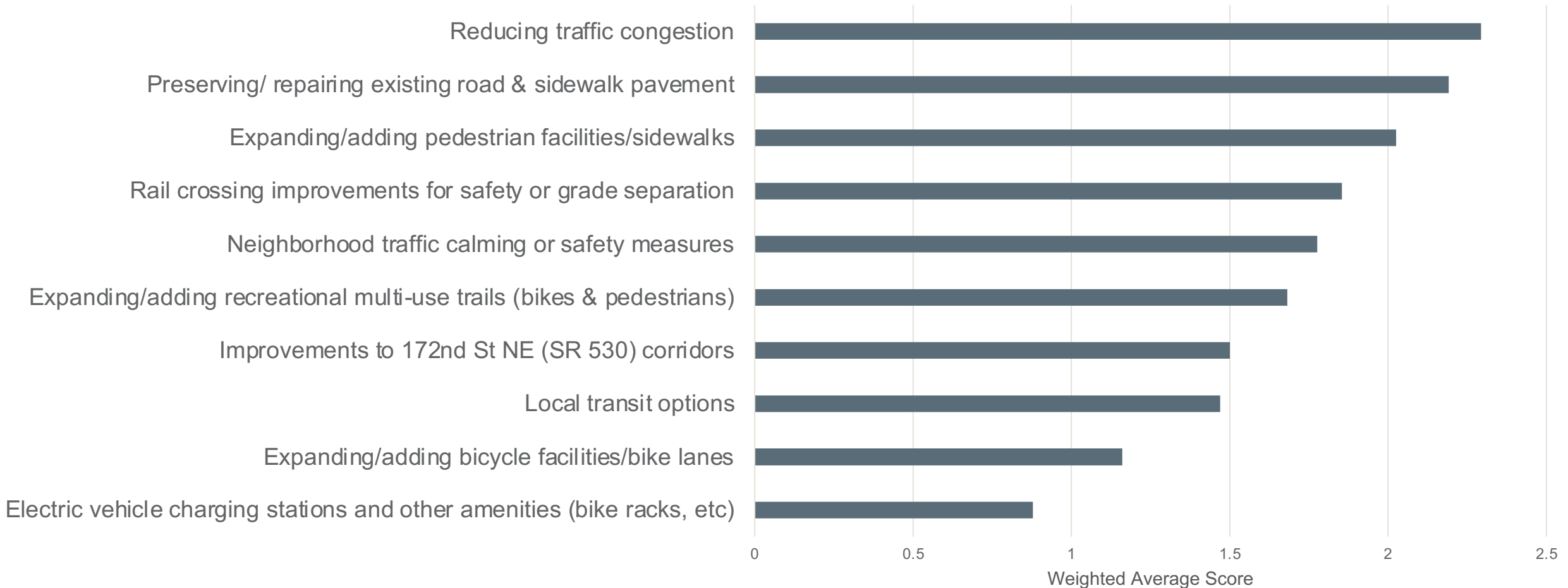

Common themes include:

- Improved enforcement of laws
- Train/rail crossing improvements

“Roadway solutions that prevent traffic from getting stuck at train crossings.”

“Widening/expanding main through streets within the city. Specifically, 88th Street and 100th Street.”

“We could use more marked crosswalks.”

Q17: OTHER COMMENTS?

87 comments

Common themes include:

- Better/improved bicycle plan/facilities
- Speeding/safety issues
- Public transportation

“It's difficult to make use of public transportation or assess walkability since many major roads don't appear to have sidewalks.”

“It would be nice to know where to give input on traffic in your neighborhood. Where stop signs or traffic calming devices would help with safety.”
