











Q8: TELEWORK VS TRADITIONAL WORK




8. If you are employed, what is your regular work schedule? (%)




10. When biking in the City, how important to you are the following factors? (Weighted average score based on: 2 = very, 1 = somewhat, and 0 = not)






Q11: TRANSIT PRIORITIES

11. When traveling by transit, how important to you are the following factors? (Weighted average score based on: 2 = very, 1 = somewhat, and 0 = not)










Q14: POTENTIAL FOR SHIFTS IN SCHOOL MODES




